7.2 School Trustee's Report

During January the Board met as the Advocacy and Community Engagement Committee and determined that we would go ahead with the Parent Council/Support Staff and Student Community engagement meetings. They have now all been held and the results will be shared once they are tabulated. My thanks to all who participated. We virtually met with our Friends of Education Award - the Maskwacis Mobile Mental Health people. They were pleased to have been nominated and the successful candidate. Virtually met with Carole Jean-Baptiste, a Wolf Creek Teacher who has been appointed to the Education Minister's Teacher Advisory Council who explained the role of the Council and gave a brief report of her first meeting.

A date for the Salary and Wage Committee meeting was set. This includes all staff that are not teachers.

The Board/Parent Council meeting was set - April 5th and your Chairperson should have received information about it.

Policies and revisions to Policies were reviewed. After every election the Board goes through their Policy Manual to become familiar with it and to revise those that are not current.

We virtually met with MLA Sarah Hoffman, Ministers Nixon and Orr on February 4 and discussed our needs with them. The Ministers were invited in order to talk about the Elementary School in Blackfalds that has been a priority for almost 20 years. Other topics discussed with all three include:

WiFi access for students, particularly on the reserve

Equity for rural education in schools

The new k - 6 curriculum

Mental health issues in Wolf Creek - particularly Social Workers in our schools: **They are not funded but are necessary** and take dollars out of our classrooms

Outside agencies that provide services to our students - that is not funded, either

I have attended a number of virtual Parent Council meetings, and TEBA (Teacher Employer Bargaining Association) meetings.

At our February meeting agenda topics included

- Establishing budget priorities and timelines (Provincial Budget out on Feb. 24)
- Reviewing Policies 4, 4A and 4B
- A review of revisions we have made to Policy 8, 8A and Appendix to Policy 12
- Discussing a meeting with the Town of Rimbey regarding an SRO position
- Setting agenda items for the Board/ATA and Board/Support Staff Liaison meetings
- Receiving information from Assistant Superintendent Danica Martin and Director Barb Reaney about the work they do for the School Division. The challenges they encounter and the contacts/networks that they work with.

The next two weeks are taken up with attending the Rural Education Symposium and the FNMI Gathering, both are held in Edmonton.

We have Virtually attended Zone 4 meetings and I have had the pleasure of Virtually attending the ASBA Provincial Board meeting as an alternate for our Zone.
