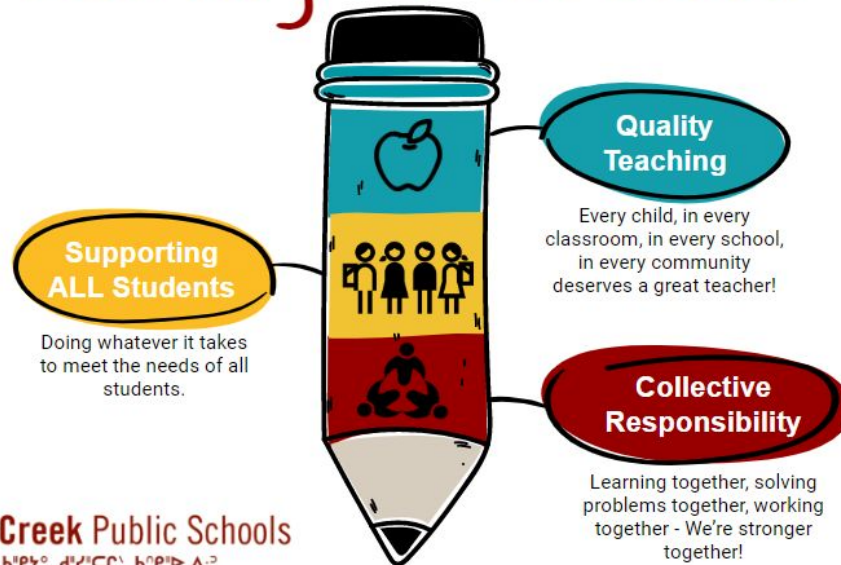

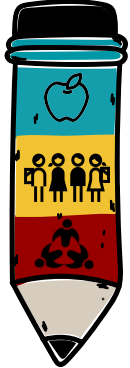

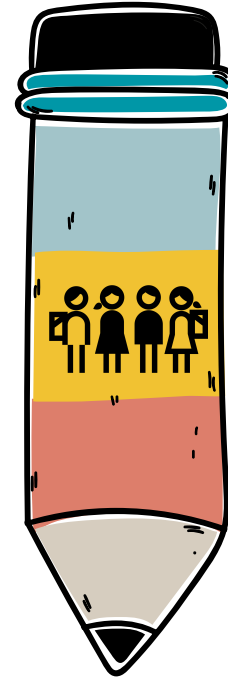
Successes and Struggles

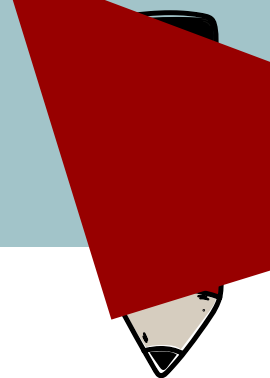

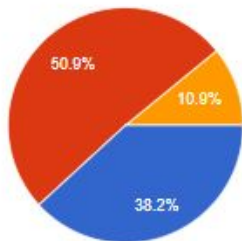

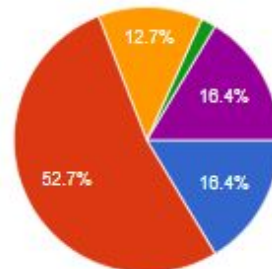

Successes:

- Teachers' agree that the learning environments are welcoming, caring, respectful and safe.

Targeted Areas For Improvement

- Improve student perception of our learning environment
- AEAMR parent results are based upon 8 parents who completed the survey - their perception is low. However, the Wolf Creek Survey, which had more parents complete the survey - indicates parents perception is higher than indicated in the AB Ed survey.
- However, it is our goal for all stakeholders to feel our learning environment is welcoming, caring, respectful and safe, therefore we need to dig deeper to understand and make necessary changes.

2023/2024 School Year STATS

- Opened 59 student cases of which 79% was for Mental Health concerns, 14.3 % was for Behavioural concerns and 6% was for Social/Emotional concerns
- Referral for SSW support came from Parents (39.9 %), Teacher (28.8 %) and self referral from students (22.7%)
- 20 Students received support through group work
- Approximately 157 students received classroom programs directly teaching self regulation and social skills
- Survey completed by students at the end of the school year will be available in September
- Most students have expressed verbally that they felt working with SSW has helped them and would recommend it to their peers

Successes

- Worked collaboratively with FCSS, PCN, AHS Mental Health
- Had a lot of new referrals for students

Targeted Areas For Improvement

- Wait time between meetings for some students was too long (3-4 weeks) which impeded progress. This was due to many reasons such as triaging needs, supporting students to self regulate in the moment, parent meetings/conversations higher than usual etc. Goal is to lessen wait times to 2 weeks (3 weeks maximum) until it is deemed time to lessen the frequency of meetings due to achieving successful outcomes.

- The Board allocates \$204,000 to school nutrition programming for 24 schools.
- These schools provide a universal program that allows for all students to participate.
- Schools have the autonomy to decide on the delivery method of the food as well as the support staff FTE allocation to coordinate the program.
- The maximum allocation is 0.2 FTE.

Successes

- Over 60 students access the breakfast program daily
- Snack bins provided to each classroom - diverse learner and EA refill the bins as a part of the student's program
- Parent council very supportive and provides hot lunches and supplemental funding if needed
- open to all students/quality breakfast available/community support through donations (gift cards/food donations)/welcoming atmosphere for students in the morning

Targeted Areas For Improvement

- Continuing to provide a variety of healthy food choices while maintaining a reasonable budget.
- Budget to last the whole year/snack bins in the classroom so the office is less busy

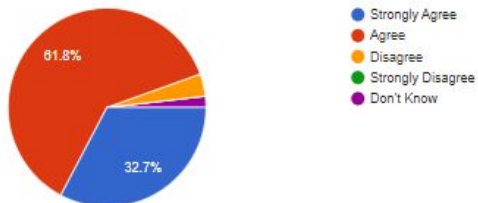

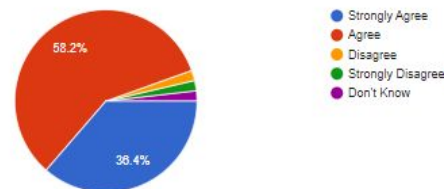
7. The literacy skills your child is learning at school are useful.

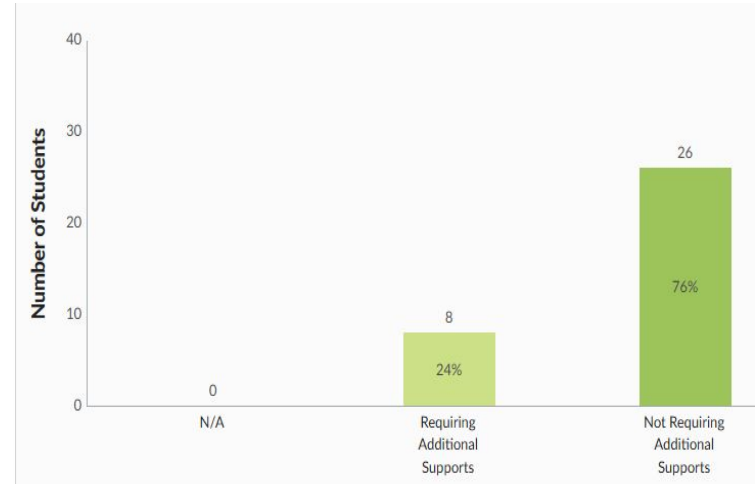
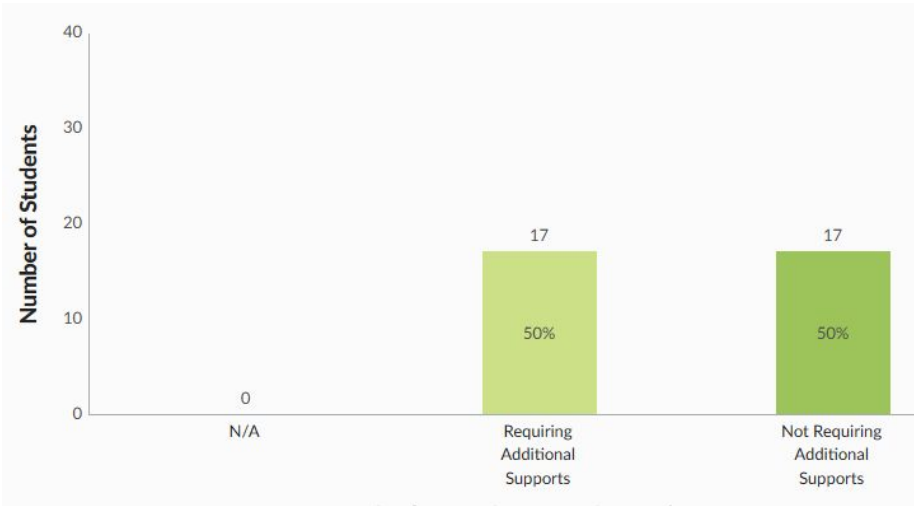
- Div 1: phonemic awareness is the main deficit for our students who are below grade level.

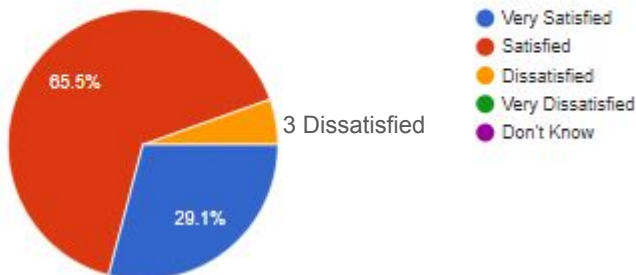

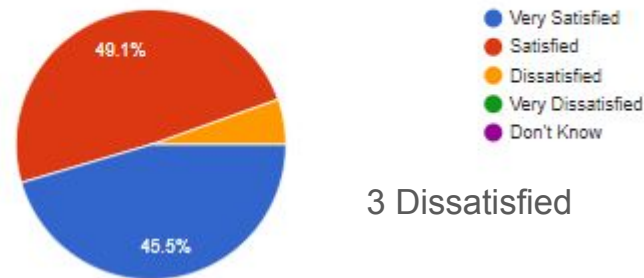
1. With the quality of education your child is receiving at school?

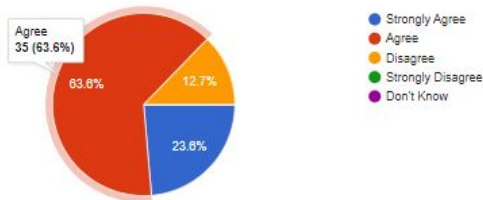

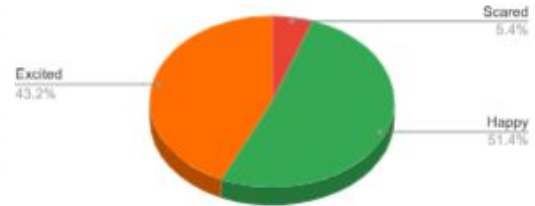

Her greatest strength is her ability to connect will all of our students - especially the tricky ones. This connection allows her to be successful in supporting our students.

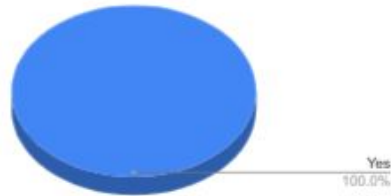
K - 3 - Did it help to meet with your counselor?



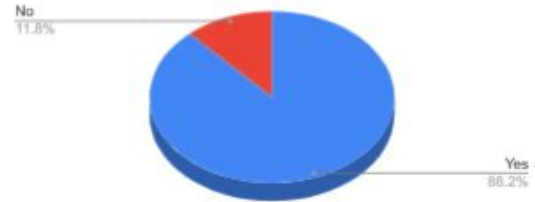
K - 3 - How do you feel when you meet with your counselor?



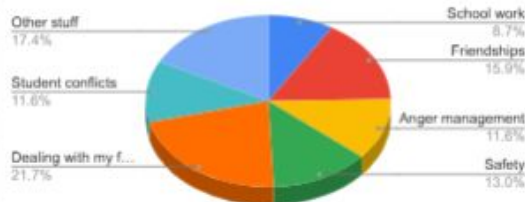

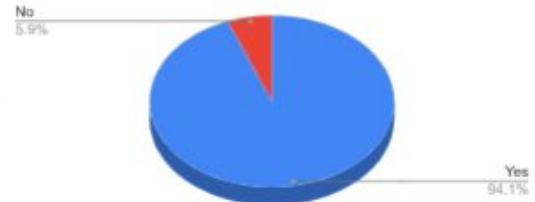
